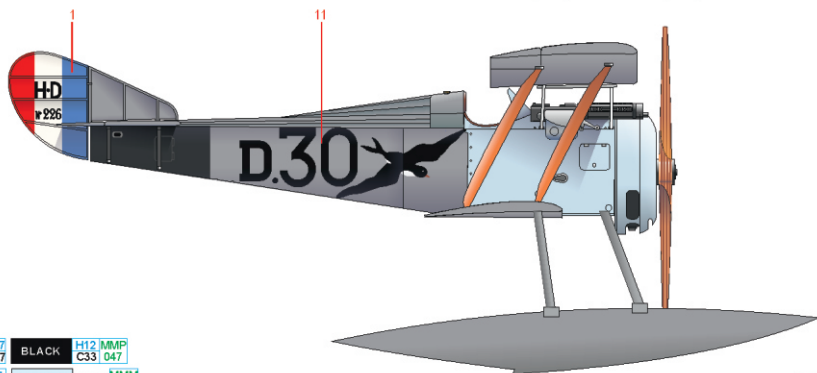
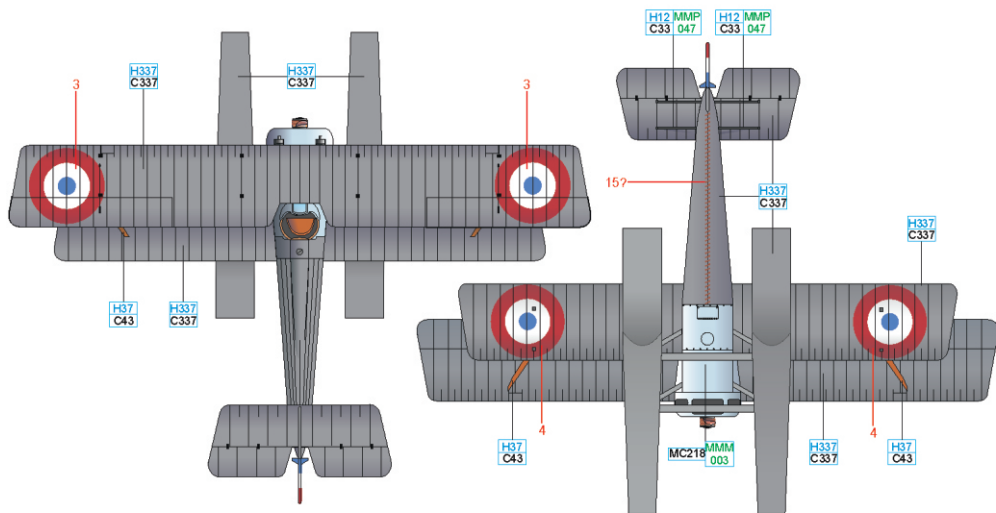


# A No. 226, Centre d'Aviation Maritime, Dunkerque, France, October 1917 – May 1918

First HD.2 airframes were delivered in October 1917 to Centre d'Aviation Maritime (CAM) based in Dunkerque. Unit's main task were escorts of the FBA and Donnet-Denhaut flying boats on their anti-submarine sorties. On May 4th, 1918, five HD.2 aircraft were jumped by six Albatros D.IIIs from Marine Feldjagdstaffel 1 based on the airport nearby Nieuwmunster in Belgium. Two French aircraft were shot down, one of them was the plane carrying number 226 and D-30 marking piloted by Maitre Le Creuer who was captured but later succumbed to his injuries. Engine cowling and the fuselage front part remained in the natural metal color, the rest of the "naval" Hanriot surfaces were painted in bluish-grey color. Marking of the aircraft belonging to this unit consisted of the letter D with the number from the 20-39 range and painting of a swallow.



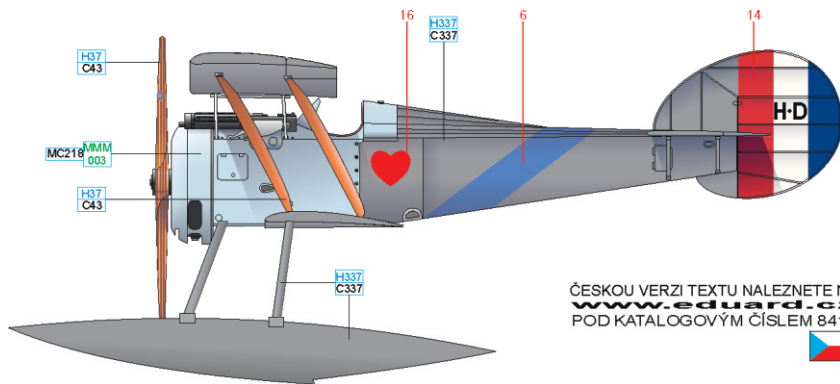

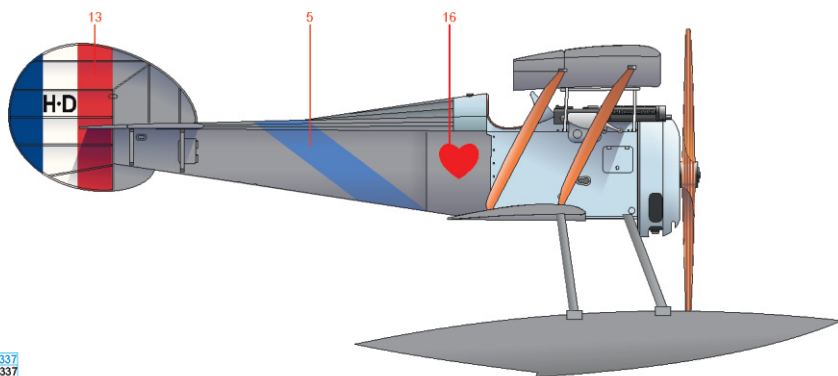
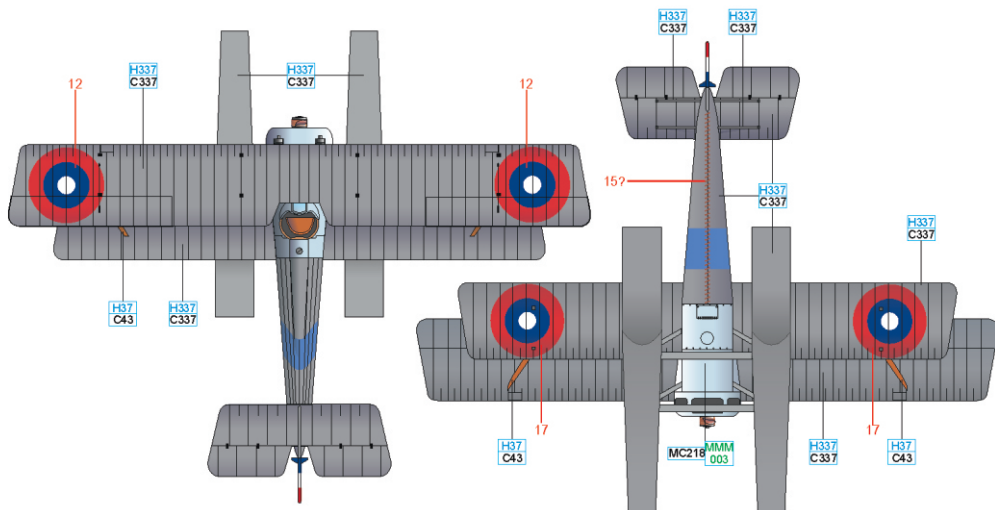

# B U. S. Navy contingent in France, Dunkerque, France, spring 1918

First Hanriots HD.2 were received by the U.S. Navy contingent in December 1917, first of the approximately 500 combat flight was performed on May 5th, 1918. Same as in the French unit, these planes flew the flying boats escorts on their anti-submarine missions. Same as the Hanriots HD.2 flying with French Naval Aviation the aircraft serving with the U.S. Navy in France were painted in bluish-gray color, front of the fuselage and the engine cowling remained in the natural metal color.
