



Building the Hawker Hurricane Mk.1 Starter Kit

This starter set comes complete with four paints, one brush and a tube of cement. While the instruction sheet is inside the box the painting and decaling guide is on the back of the box.

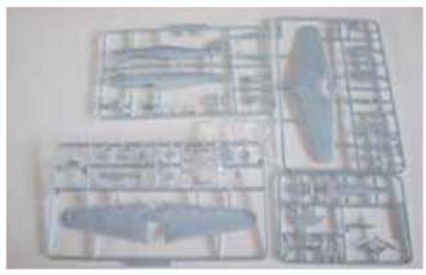


Photo 1
Forty six crisply moulded parts with finely engraved detail are carried on four sprues while six clear arts are carried on one sprue.

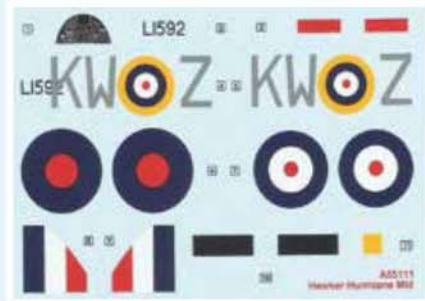

Decals are provided for a Hurricane of No615 Squadron, Royal Air Force, Kenley, England, August 1940.

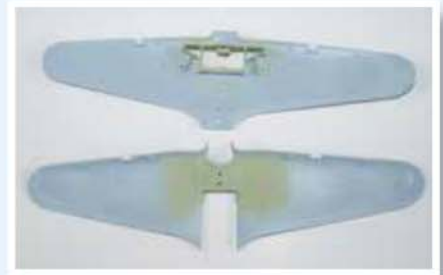

The small decal sheet carries an instrument panel. Construction starts with the main wing. Both upper and lower wing halves are moulded as one piece items with the lower wing requiring the undercarriage bay side walls to be constructed.

Six parts comprising seat, rear bulkhead, floor, rudder pedals, control column and instrument panel make up the cockpit along with a decal for the instruments.

The seat and rear bulkhead along with the instrument panel are fitted to one fuselage half. A small amount of detail is moulded to each fuselage cockpit area and a pilot figure is included.

The cockpit floor, rudder pedals and control column assembly is cemented to the upper wing spar.

With the cockpit assemblies in position the fuselage halves and wing assembly await construction.

Oil Coolers intakes and radiators are fitted to the underside of the wing while a small pipe is fitted in the centre of the undercarriage bay.
